**Brief Profile:**

Prof. (Dr.) Chanchal Kumar Singh is a graduate in Political Science (Hons.) from B.R.A. Bihar University, Muzaffarpur, Bihar (India); LL.B., LL.M. from the University of Delhi (India), and Ph.D. in Law from the same University. Prior to joining HPNLU, Shimla, he has taught at the Faculty of Law, University of Delhi for nine years. He teaches Constitutional Law, Human Rights, Legal Philosophy, Comparative Public Law, Law and Justice in a Globalising World, Legal Methods and Research Methodology, Administrative law, Legal Systems, and Judicial Process and Administration.

Professor Singh has more than 15 Years of full-time teaching and research experience (on an average, 16-18 hours of teaching and about 24 hours of research, Per Week). He has successfully supervised 02 Ph.D. theses and 25 LL.M. dissertations in addition to guiding LL.B. students in respect of their project works, seminar, and writing of research papers.
