Q.1 Short Answer Type Questions:

a) The concept 'who is a Hindu' for the purposes of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 is inclusive. But in cases where the father is Muslim and mother is Hindu, the child has been brought up in an atmosphere of religious harmony and amity. How the religion of the child would be determined in this case?

- b) Discuss the essential conditions under which a custom can be recognised as a valid source of Hindu law. Whether the custom can prevail over statutory law.
- c) H, a Hindu male and W, a Hindu female, want to get married. W, is H's Father's Father's Father's Father's son's son's son's daughter. Whether the marriage is valid or not? Discuss in the light of legislative provisions.
- d) A Hindu girl Shikha converted to Islam. She also changed her name i.e, Ruksana. Ruksana performed nikah with Muslim boy Zafar. After some time Ruksana and Zafar had differences and she returned to her parents' home. She filed a case under Section 144 of BNSS. Later she converted to Hinduism and filed a case under the Dissolution of Muslim Marriage Act, 1939. What would be the effect of apostasy in the present case?
- e) A Muslim male has four wives. He is a sailor and due to exigencies of his job, he has to remain on ship for 8 to 10 months. During one of his trips, his ship stopped near an island and their stay was extended for a few days at that island. There he found a lady and performed a Muta marriage with that lady. He fell in blind love with her and wanted to keep her as his wife permanently whereby, he delegated the power of talaq to his cousin and directed him to pronounce divorce to his 3rd wife. Whether the talaq pronounced by that man is valid? Discuss in detail.
- A child, S has been given in adoption by his natural parents. After some time, the adoptive parents died in a car accident and the child was an orphan. Whether the natural parents can take him back? Discuss what are the rights and liabilities of S in the family of his natural birth?

SECTION-B (Long-Answer/Descriptive/Analytical Type)

- Q.2 Derrett opined that the oddity of the personal law system stems from two sources: the history of India and the juridical presuppositions of the European rulers of the eighteenth century. With the help of this statement discuss how the development of personal laws is intrinsically linked to the history of colonialism?
- Q.3 (i) Apart from Batil and Sahih marriages among Muslims there is another type of marriage i.e., Fasid. What are the differences between Fasid marriage under Muslim law and voidable marriages under Hindu Law?
 - (ii) Write a comparative analysis of conditions of valid marriage under the Special marriage Act, 1954 and The Parsi Marriages and Divorce Act, 1936.
- Q.4 The general rule of legitimacy in India is the legitimisation of sexual intercourse and procreation of children through lawful marriage. In a given situation, Hira and Panna, both Hindus were married and had a son, S. For his job he went to Mirzapur where he was forced to marry Ms. Chandi as her brothers threatened him. Heera married Chandi and out of that union, they had a daughter, Z. Discuss the legitimacy of Z in the light of legislative and judicial perspective under Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 with the help of cases.
- Q.5 Deenu was married to Geeta in 2010. In 2013, they both were blessed with a son. Rahul. A few months after, the father of Deenu died in a car accident. Now Deenu, Geeta, Rahul and Deenu's old mother are left in their family. Deenu had a good ancestral textile business at Bhopal. Geeta got a government job in Gurugram and started living there with her son Rahul. Deenu on the other hand

was living with his mother in Bhopal. His wife after a couple of years started forcing Deenu to shift to Gurugram and warned him to send his mother to an old age home. But Deenu always refused to do so. Many times she insulted Deenu and his mother in front of neighbors. When instances of misbehaving rise Deenu came to you to file a petition of divorce. Advise him whether he can file the petition? Also note Deenu has disclosed that his wife has threatened him many times that she will drag him in the court for deserting her. Decide with the help of cases.

- Q.6 A marriage was solemnized between H and W in Punjab and they resided for 14 years together at the matrimonial home in Delhi. They had two daughters out of their marriage. To complete her daughter's degree, the wife went to Hyderabad so that she could get her bachelor's degree. But when she returned husband didn't allow her entry into the matrimonial home. She came to know that her husband had remarried. She filed a criminal complaint against her husband for committing bigamy. She also filed an application claiming interim maintenance and separate residence under Sections 18, 20 and 22 of HAMA. whether she is entitled to maintenance under HAMA and whether her daughters are dependent and entitled to maintenance under HAMA. Discuss in detail with the help of substantive provisions and case laws.
- Q.7 (i) What are the key differences between Khula and Mubara'at?
 - (ii) In India, the Irretrievable breakdown of marriages is formally not recognized as the ground of divorce but the judiciary has started acknowledging it to put an end to the miseries of the parties in gloomy matrimony. Discuss in detail with the help of cases.

Q.1 Short Answer Type Questions:

a) 'A' purchased 1000 shares of a company from 'B' on the basis of a prospectus issued by the Company. The prospectus issued by the company contained false statements. What are the remedies available to 'A' against the company?

- **b)** A company purchases a property without its power given in the Memorandum of Association. What is the legal position of the company with regard to the property?
- c) Explain different kinds of resolutions passed at the General Meeting of shareholders' citing appropriate provision and example of each'.
- **d)** The validity of the Incorporation Certificate cannot be disputed on any grounds whatsoever. Explain.
- e) What is a Depository? What are the benefits of using Depository system for holding securities in a company?
- f) Explain the process of voluntary liquidation of a company under Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code 2016.

- Q.2 The principle of law set out in Salomon v. Salomon & Co. Ltd. (1897) A.C. 22 (H.I.) is not always applied. Give the facts of the case and its principle of law and discuss when the judiciary or statutory provisions will not take account of that principle.
- Q.3 The board of directors of Picasso Mines Itd. Co. was approached by Mr. Frodo who wishes to sell a venture to the company. The proposal was rejected by the company after consideration by the board. Later on, Mr. William who was director of the company has purchased the venture. After few years Mr. Williams resold the venture to a company and earned huge profit. Discuss whether Mr. William is liable to account for it.

- Q.4 A shareholder of a company claims entitlement to a share of the company's land and other tangible assets, arguing that owning shares makes them a co-owner of the company's property. Separately, a debenture holder claims the same rights, asserting that debentures entitle them to ownership of specific assets of the company. Evaluate the validity of these claims with reference to the principles established in the land mark judgement and the provisions relating to shares and debentures under the Companies Act, 2013.
- Q.5 A company, having no outstanding debts, seeks to voluntarily liquidate under Section 59 of the IBC, 2016. However, a disgruntled shareholder petitions for compulsory winding up under Section 271 of the Companies Act, 2013, alleging fraudulent activities by the directors. Discuss:
 - (i) Whether the company can proceed with voluntary liquidation under the IBC despite the shareholder's petition.
 - (ii) How the courts would reconcile the overlapping provisions of Section 59 of the IBC and Section 271 of the Companies Act.
- Q.6 A company, which is mandatorily required to spend 2% of its average net profits on CSR under Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013, fails to comply with this requirement for three consecutive years. The board of directors justifies the non-compliance on the grounds of prioritizing shareholder returns over CSR spending. Discuss:
 - (i) The legal consequences of such non-compliance under the Companies Act, 2013.
 - (ii) How CSR obligations interplay with the principles of corporate governance.

- (iii) Whether prioritizing shareholder returns over CSR aligns with the company's statutory obligations and the principles of governance.
- Q.7 A minority shareholder in a private company alleges that the majority shareholders:
 - (i) Removed him from the board without adequate justification.
 - (ii) Engaged in transactions favoring entities controlled by the majority shareholders.
 - (iii) Denied access to financial records of the company.

Evaluate whether these allegations are sufficient grounds to seek relief under Section 241 and Justify your answer with relevant legal provisions and precedents.
